Spring Semester:

- 1) Apply for our local scholarships.
- 2) Fill out the FAFSA for Financial Aid (opens October 1st) and A+ by February 1.
- 3) Do your housing contract for your college.

IMPORTANT Scholarship Information

- Colleges and Universities have **scholarships** available to students.
- There are **two** basic **types**: **Automatic** and those you **must Apply** for.
- Scholarships are **Merit** (performance) or **Need** based.
- Scholarship applications have **deadlines**. They **vary** from College to College.
- Most applications are online and **can be found** through your College's **Financial Aid link**.
- You will need to be **accepted** by the College to have **access passwords** to the online scholarship applications.
- **Don't forget to ask** Ms. Mayle to send your **transcripts** if you have applied to College.

Bright Flight Scholarship – A 31 on the ACT by the June test dates for \$3000. Renewable with a 2.5 gpa in college, full time enrollment, and maintain satisfactory academic progress.

American Legion Rider Scholarship Program Post 331 – Deadline April 1st 2020.

Available to Laquey and Waynesville Seniors. Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded to two different seniors to finance college. Must have a 3.0 GPA or higher and a parent/ guardian who is a military veteran with an honorable discharge. Application and essay required. Missouri Patriot Guard Riders Scholarship – Deadline April 1st

Scholarship for Missouri students who are sons or daughters of those who: have given their lives in the line of duty both military and first responders, those honorably discharged veterans who have passed after time of service, those veterans or first responders disable in the line of duty. Amount is a non-renewable award in the amount of \$2500 to one student to any accredited institution of higher learning including vocational and business schools. Applications are available on google classroom. **Must be mailed directly to Missouri Patriot Guard Riders (address on the application) by April 1st.**

THE AMERICAN LEGION—WILLIAM C. ANDERSON, JR., MEMORIAL POST 331—Deadline April 3rd **DEADLINE EXTENDED**

\$1000 scholarship. Applicants must be a U.S. Citizen and be a current year graduating senior of either Waynesville High School or Laquey High School. The applicant must not be a recipient of a four-year scholarship, ROTC scholarship or appointment to a service academy. The award must be used at an accredited college, university, trade, technical or vocational school by a full-time student during 2020-21 school year. Applications are available in google classroom. **Must be mailed directly to the American legion post (address on the application) or emailed back to Ms. Mayle by April 3rd.**

MOCA Missouri Ozarks Community Action- Deadline April 3rd

Award: \$500. Requirements: must live in Pulaski County, be a high school senior, three letters of recommendation, transcript, verification of Head Start attendance, and an essay about future plans. Application available at: www.mocaonline.org **Must be POSTMARKED by April 3rd and mailed directly to MOCA (address on the application)**

Pulaski County Fine Arts Association- Albie Frizzle Scholarship Deadline April 3rd

Potential scholarship from local fine arts assoc. The winner will be announced at the school's annual Senior Awards ceremony. Requirements: Students of good character who demonstrate excellence in the field of drama, music, or art and are pursuing a degree in fine arts. Applications available in google classroom. **Must be emailed to Ms. Mayle by April 3rd**

Rotary Club of Pulaski County scholarship –Deadline April 8th DEADLINE EXTENDED

Potential scholarship from local Rotary members. \$500 Scholarship for Pulaski County Seniors planning to enroll as a full-time student in a Technical or Trade School or a two or Four-year Undergraduate program. Two letters of recommendation required. Essay consisting of 500 words explaining understanding of how the Rotary 4-Way test can be applied to and enhance your chosen career. Is it truth? Is it fair to all? Will it build goodwill and better friendships? Will it be beneficial? Applications available in google classroom. **Must be emailed back to Ms. Mayle by April 1st.**

Laquey Veteran's Motorcycle Club Scholarship– April 10th DEADLINE EXTENDED

Potential scholarship from local organization. A \$500 scholarship open to all seniors. Students must have a 3.0 GPA or higher, must plan to attend a college or technical school, and must write a 750 word essay on "What the Military and Constitution mean to me". **Must be emailed back to Ms. Mayle by April 10th.**

Pulaski County -FLW Shrine Ladies Scholarship Deadline April 10th

Potential scholarship from local Shrine Club. Deadline April 10th Applications available in google classroom. \$1000 scholarship to an area school senior. Application and Essay required. Typed essay required, topic is 750-1000 words talking about your area of study in college and why, as well as how, you plan to use this knowledge for the betterment of the community. Waynesville Rural Fire Dept- Robert D. Wait Memorial Scholarship Deadline April 10th

DEADLINE EXTENDED Application available in google classroom. Potential Scholarship from local FD. One, \$1000 scholarship within the boundaries of the Waynesville Rural Fire Protection District. Must be entering an accredited institution to obtain a 2 or 4-year degree certificate. One time, non-renewable. WE THE STUDENT ESSAY CONTEST—Deadline April 15th

The Contest is open to all United States citizens or legal residents who are students who are no older than 19 and no younger than 14 as of the end of the Contest Period who (1) attend school in the United States, one of its territories or districts, or an American Armed Forces School Abroad, and (2) who are in grades 8 -12 attending public, private, religious, or charter schools, or (3) are enrolled in a GED or correspondence school program, or (4) are attending a home school program.
